In 2024, going to the president. Of those voted this year, 35%, in order for person. In New Jersey. 2024. 46% from New Jersey. Voting to President Trump. This year, over 42% of the New Jersey election, I voted for President Trump. New York City? 30%. 30%. The New York City voters, last year, passed their ballot for President Trump. By the way, that is a significant record. Give me 30% of New York City's... And now we get the game, 2024, President Prophecy, 46% vote, in Virginia, the truck voters only represented, 42%. of this year's left. Last year, 46% of vocal president's jobs, this year, only 42% of the election had more impressive trade. Now, this four point decline is effectively greater than four points. Wow. He's not ready. I, I, I, he was former member of this group, but, but there was somebody out there that, you know, saw and check on their nomination. They don't get the significant number signatures. And decided that they were going to conduct a writing with me. That when you had to write any campaign, got less than a quarter percent of the vote. So was it significant? No. But guess what? It took up time for lots of people in the party, trying to corral people in, saying, No, you can't go to that and that. You can't do that. And we have this problem, even at the local level, where people get upset, because the party nominates one candidate over the other, for a worse... And you've got a cat in your committee running off, thinking, Oh, we don't have to abide for what the price is. Yeah, you do. There's a difference between being a member of a group like this and being a member of a Republican Committee. If you're a member of a Republican community, you are obliged. You are required to back the nominee, whether you like them or not. I don't like any of our parties normally. Oh, my God, I've actually a tourum in 2012, wrong me. That costs it over McCain in in 2008. I mean, until Trump, I couldn't pick a winner to save my life and buy where I didn't pick her up in 2016, I'm still listening to her. So, you know, I mean, um, yeah, guess what? Donald Trump got a nomination, you know what happens? Sign in the yard, get out, make sure that we electronic. That the way it works. But when I'm sorry, you had a question from John. Go ahead. I'm sorry. I think there were 11 candidates, Democrats, that had files and challenges, Rob Whitman, and there's still 10 on the night, that one dropped out, and eight or nine, that would be Jen Kegins, and we'll take you out through this. And sometimes, if we're not agreeing, we're everything that we offer, Ben is doing... There's not a reason to go out or not go out on the boat. Right. 10 years ago. I know. We... These are luxuries we can't afford. And let me tell you, as much as we can't afford them in federal law, we really can't afford them in Virginia. We really can't. Chuck and them in New York. How's that? We heard from a couple of different directions that the uh, the turnout is looking very favorable for uh, for Republicans, especially in Republican strongholds. But it didn't turn out that way at the end. So where was that initial optimism coming from? Well, actually, in the early morning, was very close to the in person early in vote, right? It was fairly close to the estimate. And in most cases, where they're giving you those estimates are giving you based on the in-person early vote. The mail in vote is a little more difficult for the party to track. takes a little longer. So, in fact, it was encouraging, and in fact, early mode, in person early, you really have, kind of, caught up where democrats are on that. We're doing better on that than than we were, uh, way back in 2021. And in fact, uh, previous week, I started blowing that this year in 2024. That being said, the permanent actions he list is going to be a killer for us, election, after election, after election. Uh, and that's uh, that's a problem for us. Um, and I, you know, I don't know necessarily that the Republican nomination for governor was something that was highly desired by people other than Lieutenant Governor. And the reason there wasn't one for attorney general was we had the incumbent, and it's, that's not that common. Your 2nd question is about... Let me defend the house box here a little. I would love to run a candidate every single seat. We have years where we got to come close to that, but... The challenge is, how many people in Ireland are going to put their name on the ballot? How many people in Alexandria are willing to put their name on the ballot, with Republican society? No, well, likely work, the outcome of that election is going to be devastated. Now, we've done things, we did things, when I was with Senate, to help mitigate that somewhat, we created, what was called internally the balance program, but I always referred to this program. And the reason why is because you get people who are brave enough to come forward and make those races. But the party can't, under ordinary circumstances, invest a lot of money in their campaigns because it's not a campaign in their win. Parties in the process of work from the job.
